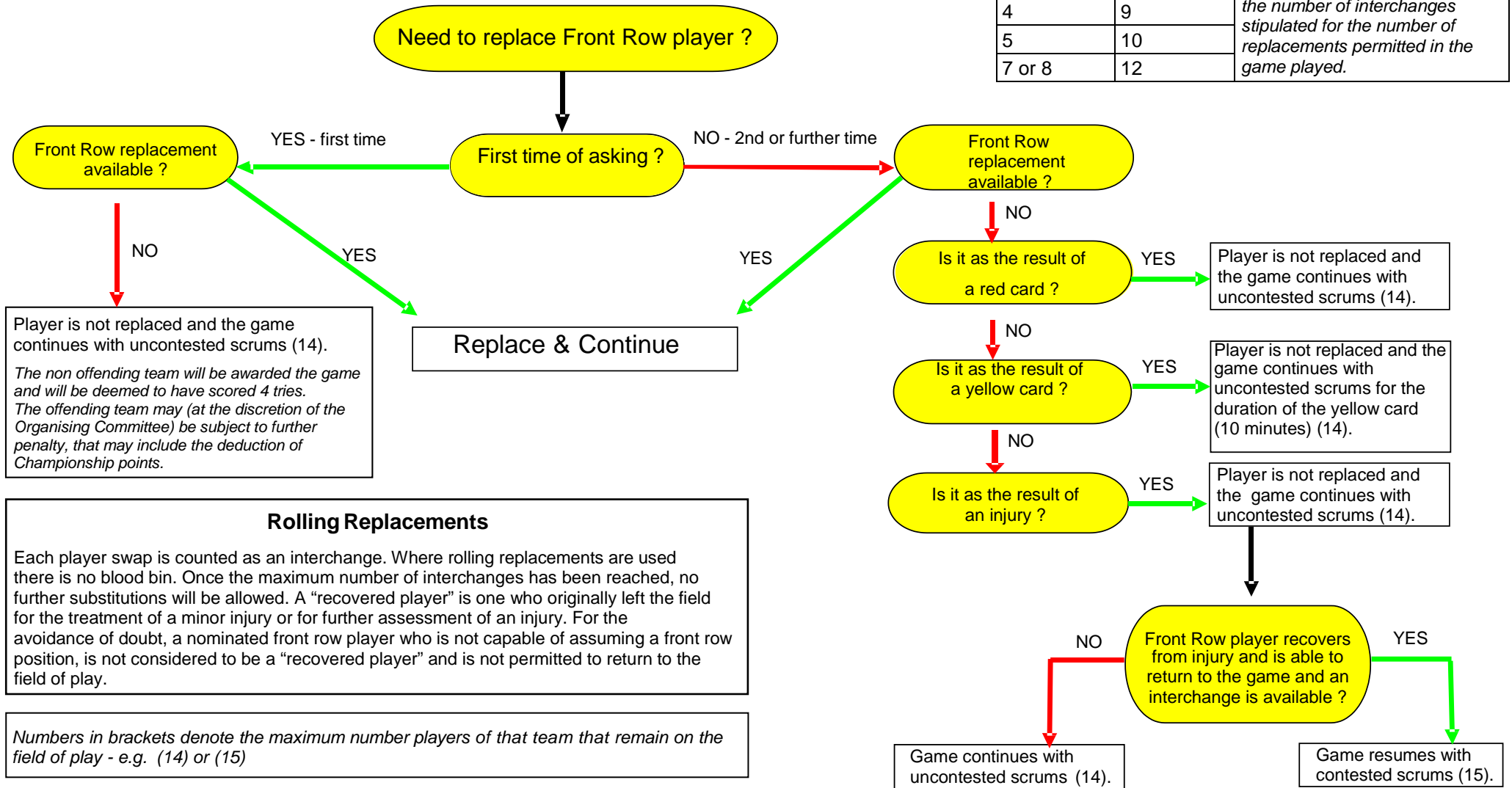


For Guidance Only - FR Logic Tree - IRB Law & RFU Regulation take Precedence

For use when one front row replacement is required in the squad e.g. at Level 5 and below.

| No. of Replacements | No. of Interchanges | Teams fielding fewer than the permitted number of replacements will still be allowed the number of interchanges stipulated for the number of replacements permitted in the game played. |
|---------------------|---------------------|---|
| up to 3 | 8 | |
| 4 | 9 | |
| 5 | 10 | |
| 7 or 8 | 12 | |



Rolling Replacements

Each player swap is counted as an interchange. Where rolling replacements are used there is no blood bin. Once the maximum number of interchanges has been reached, no further substitutions will be allowed. A "recovered player" is one who originally left the field for the treatment of a minor injury or for further assessment of an injury. For the avoidance of doubt, a nominated front row player who is not capable of assuming a front row position, is not considered to be a "recovered player" and is not permitted to return to the field of play.

Numbers in brackets denote the maximum number players of that team that remain on the field of play - e.g. (14) or (15)
